You, like me, are probably busy with new things and a new schedule. Perhaps you have suspended your piano studio for the present time, or maybe you are teaching via Skype or FaceTime. This is a good time to get creative with your

studio!

I have had a plethora of piano teaching suggestions in my email inbox. They range from The College Music Society, Teaching Music in the Age of Covid-19 and American Music Teacher, MTNA with podcasts and soon, streaming of video from the convention that never happened, to Minnesota Public Radio, reminding me that listening to the radio is free these days. (And hopefully always will be)

What are you doing with your studio? Staying in touch with students helps them remember that we will be there when distancing lifts. I recently chose music for each of my students from books I have on hand (and plan to use for each student later), scanned each individual piece with CamScanner from my phone, and sent it to each parent's email. All of it is jazz, even for the little ones. (I am aware of copyright infringements, so the music has my name on it, and will be returned to me.) This is our Jazz Moment. Before the sad news about not going to nursing homes I had asked each student to find a piece of music on their own that is from a movie or is Broadway inspired to prepare for a trip to a long term care center for a performance. Keeping them working on technique and classical pieces is wonderful, but having some fun musical downtime is wonderful, as well!

There are many tutorials on YouTube using technology for distance teaching if you are interested. Having a blog, or using twitter to allow students in the studio to respond is one way to keep them in touch. Students might appreciate being aware of resources like Minnesota Public Radio or King FM. Now that I am thinking about this, I will contact everyone and ask that they choose a composer and tell me about one piece of music they enjoyed. Since Beethoven's 350th year birthday coming up in December a Beethoven Only might be fun to organize.

I know that this time is stressful for many, if not all of us. It is much more difficult and time consuming to teach virtually, and the challenge of teaching remotely is compounded by financial and health worries. At least it is for me. But I have found in my life that when I am most frustrated I work hardest for solutions. This translates down the road into strengths I never knew I had. Let's rely on our community of musicians and support each other. I don't have the computer savvy to put together a forum of distance teaching ideas, or a distance support group, but I think we should consider everyone in this group would be happy to lend a voice of support if we need it.
