My family has spent these last two weeks of December in Beirut, Lebanon, visiting my daughter who is a humanitarian worker here. From the apartment balcony, I am hearing traffic sounds and vibrant voices and a call to prayer. I am listening to "Surely He Hath Borne Our Griefs" from Handel's Messiah, featured today in my online advent devotional. I am recalling with joy and relief the five zoom recitals that my students performed for their grandparents with my help, a fine substitute for our annual holiday concert visit at the Wesley Homes retirement center and nursing home. On Christmas Eve, we attended a Maronite community's midnight mass in the mountains above Beirut, among olive and cedar groves. The tonalities used were often surprising and the only strain I really recognized was the Gloria in Excelsis Deo, which we sang along with

the choir. (Have you ever seen the Mr Bean skit when he only knows the Hallelujah

part of the hymn? Felt a bit like that!)

Passing into the new year in a country whose economy is absolutely broken but whose people maintain a joy of the present moment, an appreciation of diversity, and a commitment to hospitality both on the personal and national level, inspires me to bring these intentions into my own home and work life when I return. I know I will hit the ground running, planning for the scholarship fundraiser, MAP and chapter student recital, and helping my son stay sane while churning out his college applications, but what I have seen here will remind me to walk on, and embrace, and celebrate the small things, when I feel fear of the unknown or even failure. And I thank God for the musical soundtrack carrying us all along, providing reminders of hope, faith and common humanity.

Happy New Year, SKCMTA! I am looking forward to seeing you and your students this month!

This month, our presenter will be Dr. Mario Ajero, beginning at 10:30. It will be a Masterclass, featuring three students from our chapter. Here is a bio of our presenter:

Dr. Mario Ajero, NCTM is Professor of Piano at Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches, TX where he teaches applied piano lessons, group piano classes, and piano pedagogy and serves as the keyboard area coordinator. He holds Bachelor's and Master's Degrees in Music from Temple University in Philadelphia, PA and earned his Ph.D. in Music Education with a concentration in piano pedagogy from the University of Oklahoma. Dr. Ajero has served as Coordinator of Class Piano for Temple University's Music Prep Division and served as Lecturer in Piano for Temple University's Boyer College of Music and Dance in Philadelphia, PA. Internationally recognized as an authority in incorporating technology in piano pedagogy and music education, he is frequently sought as a presenter for conferences around the world. Recent engagements include presentations for The Peabody Institute at Johns Hopkins University, The Royal Conservatory, and The Frances Clark Center. In addition to presenting at every major piano pedagogy conference in the United States, Dr. Ajero has been invited to perform and present in Canada, Australia, Brazil, Germany, and China.
