"The Arboreal Perspective of Music"

#### Nature as a model for melody and harmony in music composition, arrangement and

improvisation. An intuitive approach to creating music, based on the spontaneous identification of triads

which connect chords with the possible melodies that can be played over them. This approach utilizes forms derived from Nature (in this case, trees) as templates for building musical structures, from very simple to very complex. It also applies the same organic templates to rhythmic development and the creation of grooves.

3-time Latin Grammy nominee Jovino Santos Neto is a master pianist, flutist, composer, arranger, conductor and educator from Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. After 15 years as a member of the legendary Hermeto Pascoal Group, he moved to Seattle in 1993. Since then, Jovino has established himself as a charismatic performer, whether playing solo piano, leading his Trio, his award-winning Quinteto, or in guest appearances with ensembles and orchestras worldwide. He

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has shared the stage and the studio with some of the most creative musicians of our times. Jovino lectures online and in person about the connections between Music and Nature.
