



Dorla is a piano teacher who supports piano teachers with organized and engaging resources to help them offer excellent group piano classes. She believes that teaching in a group setting is one of the best ways to keep the world of piano teaching alive during this century.

Over the past three years, Dorla has created a framework in which it is possible to teach students of different ages and skills, namely students between the ages of 8 to 14 who are beginners up to early intermediate level.

Dorla received her Master of Music in Piano Pedagogy from Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, Texas, has taught early childhood music, private and group piano for more than 30 years, and is an adjunct professor of music (Distance Education) at Southwestern Adventist University in Keene, Texas.
